## **IV. Materials Needed**

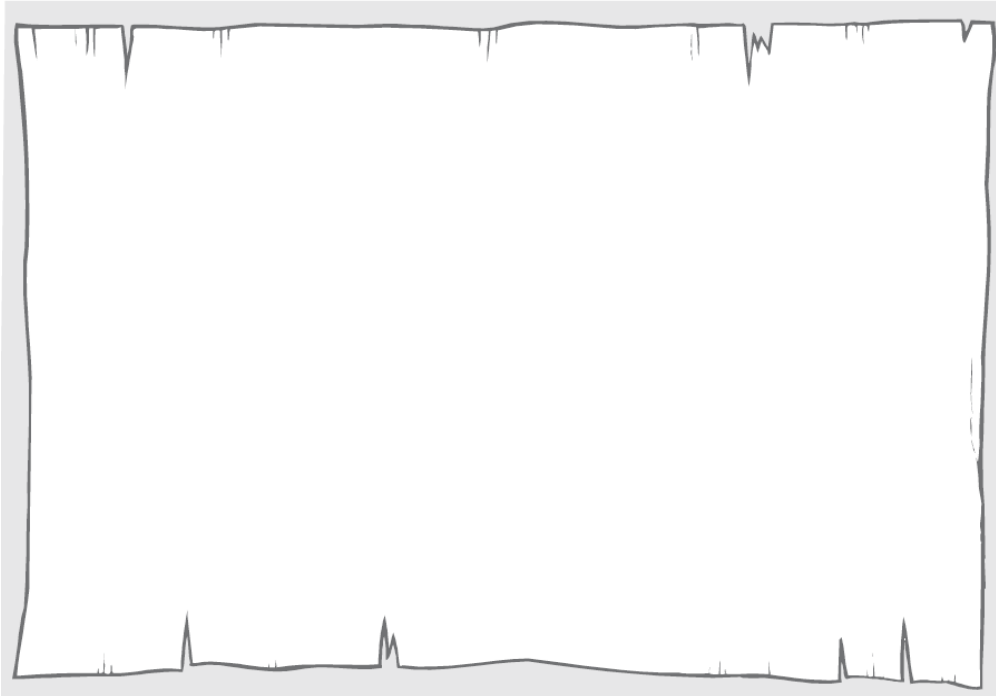
- Pencil or pen
